Unfortunately, for each new advancement in prevention, there is someone out there working hard to overcome your find a way to security and get your money or property. The list is long for Theft Prevention because there are so many crimes included in the term "THEFT". These are just a few of the many prevention tips.

- Close the garage door when not in or near the garage
- Lock your doors, even if you are home (unless you would like to allow people to come in without an invitation from you)
- Request a Home-Security Check, or conduct one yourself using available resources
- Have good security on your home and work computer.
- Do not open emails that are in any way suspicious, even if they appear to be from someone you know.
- If something is valuable to you, don't leave it where it can be easily seen and taken.

IdentityTheft.gov Offers Personal Recovery Plans

The FTC announced new features at <u>IdentityTheft.gov</u> that make it easier to report and recover from identity theft. When you use <u>IdentityTheft.gov</u> to report a problem, you'll get a personal recovery plan that walks you through each recovery step, tracks your progress and adapts to your changing situation, and pre-fills letters and forms for you. It is also available in Spanish at <u>RobodeIdentidad.gov</u>.

BLOCK CAPTAIN'S TRAINING RE-CAP

Block Captains training was held February 18, 2016. At his meeting information on the **Predatory Offender Registration Program** was presented by the Minnesota Department of Corrections(DOC). A .pdf file of the presentation is available from your block captain or you may find a similar presentation on the DOC website: http://www.doc.state.mn.us/pages/index.php/supervision-community/reentry-resources/ If you go to the site you will also find other useful information including safety tips and a video presentation on the program.

We also discussed the future of the **T.I.P.S. Newsletter** and the best means for the police department to send information out, and in what format watch members will receive it from Block Captains. All groups are encouraged to develop a means of communicating information with members which may include: Email List, Nextdoor or another web based virtual block club, Telephone Tree, or hard-copies hand delivered. If you have an email you can share with your block captain, this may make timely communication of information easier for them. Please discuss at your next watch meeting and let your captain's know the best way to reach you.

We also discussed many **scams** that have become prevalent in our community as well as everywhere else. Excellent prevention resources on many scams are available on the Minnesota Attorney General's http://www.ag.state.mn.us/Consumer/ website: Default.asp. We have had several cases in New Hope where victims have lost several hundred, to several thousand dollars to scammers. Unfortunately, once the money is sent, many times to a foreign country, there is not much chance we can do anything to get it back. Please continue to educate yourself on the current scams and talk to friends, family, and neighbors about what you learn. IF IT SOUNDS TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE, IT IS!

This is not new information, but it does bear repeating. I read through the reports each week and see that people are being conned out of their money and personal property because of the lure of easy money, or a convincing con artist. though it would be nice to receive large amounts of money unexpectedly, in the back of your mind, you know you have not won a foreign lottery that you did not enter. If you are selling something on a website, that same place in your mind will tell you there is not a genuine offer in which someone will pay you more than your asking price. Anyone who has ever sold online, or tried to sell any items at a garage sale, knows that the customer will almost always try to talk you down in price before agreeing to buy any item. There definitely is someone who will send you a fraudulent check for more than the amount you're asking, take the item, and be long gone before you or the bank can discover the fraud. Be wary and take time to investigate anything that doesn't seem legitimate.

LIQUID NICOTINE CHILD RESISTANT POISONING LAW SIGNED BY PRESIDENT

Liquid nicotine is the substance that goes into ecigarettes. The bill, <u>S. 142 the Child Nicotine Poisoning Prevention Act</u>, requires the Consumer Product Safety Commission to hold liquid nicotine vials to the same standard of child resistant packaging as other poisons or medication. The bill was signed into law by President Obama on January 28, 2016.
